MAY DAYS

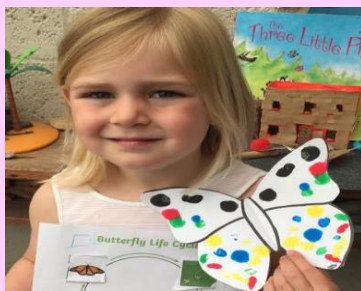
Which plants and insects are seen only in the month of May?

COOKERY CORNER

Playdough

If you are indoors why not **help** to make some playdough **with an adult**. You all love playing with it at school and it is fun to make too.

This is the recipe I use:

2 cups plain flour, 1/2 cup salt, 2 tablespoons vegetable or baby oil, 2 tablespoons cream of tartar, 1 to 1 1/2 cups boiling water with food colouring of choice.

Mix the flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil in large bowl.

Adults-Add the food colouring to boiling water then add in increments to the dry ingredients.

Stir until it becomes a sticky combined dough.

(Please be careful with boiling water).

Leave to cool. Then take from the bowl and knead for a couple of minutes until all the stickiness has gone. If still sticky add more flour until just right.

I normally keep it in fridge between play sessions. Have fun!

Finding north using the sun

1 Maps are usually drawn with north at the top, so finding north is very useful.

2 Because planet Earth spins round once per day, we can use where the sun is in the sky to find north.

3 NEVER look at the sun. It will damage your eyes

4 At 12 noon in winter and 1pm after the clocks change for summer, the sun is to the south, so if the sun is directly behind you at 1pm, you are facing north. Your shadow will also point north at this time.

5 Plant a stick pointing straight up (or anything straight works, like a gardening fork, or a washing line pole). At 1pm, mark where the shadow is. This is north. What happens to the shadow at different times of day?
