## **Pandas**

This week we have made panda models. The reason is because we did a non-chronological report all about them. So we each designed and made a model.

Things you will need: scissors, paint, newspaper, tights, modroc and water.

First you need to make your sculpture out of tights or newspaper. If you are making your panda out of tights, you will need get some paper and stuff it in to the tights and try to make it look like a bear while keeping stuffing until full. Then apply the modroc (wet) before use and apply. Try to cover up all the holes so that you don't have to paint your panda white as the modroc is already white.

After letting it dry, apply black paint (mixed with glue) and then let it dry.
