# **Pre-School at Cotherstone Primary**

We are really excited to inform you that we will be opening preschool provision from September 2021. We will be returning the Dinosaur Room to classroom use for focused work for years 1 and 2 whilst Class 1 will be used for continuous provision including for nursery children. In order to provide for this we have followed the advice and guidance of Durham County Council's Early Years Team, who have approved the arrangements. We will be able to offer 30 hours funded placements and 15-hour provision as well as private places as appropriate for rising 3s, 3 and 4 year olds. Please contact the school if you are interested.

## Obelisk investigation by Class 2

As part of our Science Topic, 'Light', we planned an investigation to see how shadow length and position changes throughout the day. As a link to our topic, Ancient Egypt, we explored what an obelisk is and used an obelisk to track the length and position of a shadow throughout the day.

We made predictions before we carried out our investigation and wrote a list of equipment and our scientific method. We thought about how we would make sure it was a fair test.

We waited for a day where it was going to be sunny all day long to carry out our investigation. We found out that the shadow was the longest in the morning at 9:15am and the shortest at 1:15pm and the shadows moved clockwise. To present our results we made a bar graph and wrote our conclusion for why we thought this happened.

#### Class 3

This week in our D.T. lesson we cooked some delicious South American-style empanadas to link in with this term's Geography topic - South America.

To make the filling for the empanadas we added tomatoes, mozzarella, basil, parmesan and olive oil and then we made our pastry using plain flour, butter, baking powder (although one group forgot to include it!) and a small amount of water. Lots of different cooking skills and techniques were required from chopping, mixing, measuring, weighing, rolling, shaping and combining ingredients.
