We were able to donate some to the Barnard Castle Food Bank and a record amount of £1,011 was raised at the Auction of Produce on the following Monday evening.

The children all studied languages from some of our nearest neighbours (France, Spain and Germany) for the European Day of Languages.

The MacmIllan Coffee Morning raised valuable funds for this important charity.
