## Little Learner's Pre-school

We have had such a busy time in Pre-school since we returned after the school holiday. Our topic this half term is 'People Who Help Us'. We have looked at several different jobs that people do and focused on Firefighters and Doctors this week. The children have enjoyed dressing up as firefighters, sharing books about them, completing cutting and sticking activities, watching how they help people on the interactive whiteboard, singing songs and painting them.

We have also been practising how to wash our hands properly (as it can be tricky for little people when they can't physically see any germs) and washing germs off a plastic balloon hand too! We have warmly welcomed 'Thom' who has just started Pre-school and enjoyed making marks on the large interactive whiteboard. He thought it was quite magical!

The children have been most helpful this week as they have each taken a turn to give out the snack and milk. Children love being given little jobs to do too. ③



Class 1

This half term in P.E we are learning gymnastics. The children had great fun using the mats in the hall to balance on different parts of their body and demonstrate different point balances and rolls.





#### Science

The children have been learning about different microbes and which ones are harmful and which ones are not. We talked about how they are tiny living things that are all quite often too small to be seen with our eyes. We discussed the three types of microbes and then the children used some playdough to make them and discuss with their peers which ones they chose to make and why.

### This week in Class 3


