Class 2

This week in Class 2 we have been using partitioning to double 2-digit and 3-digit numbers, as well as using the grid method and the ladder method to multiply 3-digit numbers. We have also been looking at word problems and reasoning, where we had to decide whether or not the problem was multiplication or division, before calculating the answer.

In Literacy, we have been writing expanded noun phrases to help with our poetry and descriptive writing.

In Geography, we looked at how the UK has changed over time and the reasons for this including war and immigration.

And...of course, we had SPACE CAMP!! Here is a report all about it:

This Space Camp was awesome! We made balloon rockets. We saw the International Space Station go over at 8:55pm. It passed just underneath Orion's Belt from west to east and was very bright. We made and measured craters using different objects. We also made asteroid cakes, fizzy planets, watched 'Space Buddies', made constellation projectors, did astronaut training and got barely any sleep! We all enjoyed it. By Billy and Finley.

This week in Class 3

It has been a very busy week in Class 3! In History we have been exploring the question 'How did WW2 affect children in Britian?' as part of this we have explored evacuation and rationing. Class 3 used sources of evidence from the past to build up a picture of evacuation. From this, they created a letter from an evacuee to their parents. They included information about rationing and reflected on the experiences they heard from audio footage of WW2 evacuees. They wrote their letters on tracing paper and then created a drawing of an evacuee to place behind which made them look incredible!

In Design and Technology this week we explored parts of a Mars Rover. Class 3 then recreated this with each child being a 'part'. They explored what each part was used for and sketched these. This research and preparation is working towards Class 3 designing and creating their own Mars Rover.

We had a very busy end to the week with SPACE CAMP!
