Our new school library!



Class 1 and 'Little Learners'

We have had a superfull week at preschool with our 3-4 years olds and 4-5 year olds. We have been enjoying the September sunny weather. On Tuesday we chased our shadows on the playground and then Miss Lee drew around each of the children laid on the playground. The children then drew their facial features using chalk and coloured the outline of themselves in. We have been on an Autumn hunt and created our own 'Autumn stick' by placing the different coloured leaves of autumn poked on a stick. We have been enjoying 'Dough disco' daily with the playdough and strengthening our fingers. The children have also been leaning to share and take turns by playing a variety of games indoors and also the Reception children have started to learn letter sounds this week. Well done everyone!











In Class 1, we have had a busy week this week continuing our work on Place Value in maths. We have been using place value charts, making tens and ones and partitioning numbers using the part/whole model. In literacy we have been using adjectives to describe characters and writing descriptive sentences about ourselves. We have continued to learn about The Great Fire of London in history and how it started. In P.E we have been practising our throwing and catching skills in preparation to play 'Piggy in the middle'. We have also been learning about the features of a church in R.E and basic computer skills in computing. Keep up the good work!

This week in Class 2

This week in maths we took our learning outside! The children made place value grids on the yard using sticks and challenged their peers to make numbers up to 1,000 with natural materials. Their enthusiasm was great!

In literacy we have continued our work on 'Marshmallows' and we have been looking at conjunctions and thinking about how we can use them to improve our writing. We have also started to look at a non-chronological report, as we get ready to create our own monsters, before writing a non-chronological report about them! I can't wait to read them!

In history the children have been creating a world timeline for us to display in our classroom and I am super impressed by their creativity and enthusiasm! Take a look at some of their posters!

This week in Class 3

Another busy week in Class 3! Famous author visits, swimming, Roald Dahl week and frogs flying on lilypads to name a few activities!

We have continued our work on Place Value this week, moving up to numbers to 1 million and 10 million! I have been completely in awe of Class 3's maths work - they have all developed incredible problem solving and reasoning skills in previous years and to see them now in upper key stage two with the confidence they have to tackle problem solving questions is **incredible**.

We started our new text this week 'Tuesday'. An almost wordless picture book from a picture book great, David Wiesner. One night, the frogs of a pond all lift off on their lily pads and fly to a nearby town causing havoc as they go. Some frogs enjoy chasing after birds on a telephone wire, some flogs fly around houses and others stop to watch TV. The people in the neighbourhood are puzzled as to why there are lily pads all over the roads and they begin an investigation. The frogs even make the evening news. What will happen next Tuesday? Perhaps pigs might fly! Class 3 will be writing newspaper reports based on the crazy events over the coming week and so our literacy lessons will focus on developing writing skills needed for this genre.

In our science lesson this week, Class 3 classified animals into different groups for example those with an endoskeleton or exoskeleton! Next week, we will look at how to create a classification key!
