### **Newcastle Life Science Centre Trip**

The whole-school trip to the Life Science Centre on Tuesday was brilliant! Each class took part in a wide range of enriching science activities throughout the day. We visited the planetarium, took part in workshops linked to our science topics, explored the 'Brain Zone', 'Space Zone' and viewed a Science Theatre show! #### This week in Class 1

Class 1 had an amazing time at the Life Science Centre on Tuesday. We started off with a few science experiments using our senses. First we had to dress as scientists wearing our white coats and protective glasses. Then we learnt how to use a pipette and measure accurately. We used our sense of smell to decide which smelt the strongest: an orange rind or a piece of orange. We used our sense of sight to mix different colours of liquid in test tubes and then we went on to make and feel our own gloop! Next we moved on to find out about our brain and how it works. The children even got to see a real human brain! After dinner we learnt about space and the planets. We travelled up into space and had to keep a check on our oxygen level, water level and our carbon dioxide level. We watched some great experiments before coming back down to Earth. Finally, we watched and listened to a story in the theatre about little bear and the stars.  $\square$ 

























#### This week in Class 2

We have had a great week this week! Starting off with our Life Science Centre trip on Tuesday, where the children had the opportunity to take part in some great activities, not to mention seeing a real brain! Have a look at the pictures to see all the fun we got up to!

In literacy, we are enjoying writing a non-chronological report on the 'Mallodile', you could ask them to describe it to you, they are all experts!

In maths, we are continuing with our place value work, looking at partitioning numbers up to 1,000 (YR3) and partitioning numbers up to 10,000 (YR4). We have also been exploring place value through games both in pairs and in teams!

In history, we have been putting the finishing touches on our world timeline, which will soon be displayed in our classroom, and we have started to look at the timeline from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, discussing key dates and changes.

In art, we have started to explore pottery from the Stone Age and their enthusiasm towards art is great! They have started by researching pottery made and used in the Stone Age, before designing their own and adding a pattern. I can't wait to see their designs come to life over the next couple of weeks!

Last week we got stuck into our whole class reading sessions, exploring Roald Dahl and celebrating Roald Dahl Day. This week we are all enjoying our new books in guided reading. You could ask your child to tell you about their new book?!




































































## This week in Class 3
