This week in Class 3

We have been reading our text, Malamander, in literacy this week. A 'Lost-and-Foundry' appeared in the reading corner full of mysterious objects which were left in 'The Grand Nautilus Hotel'. We learnt about how to use hyphens and created labels to describe the items. We talked about how a man eating shark has a very different meaning to a man-eating shark and how hyphens help us to avoid this ambiguity. We also explored colons for lists. This helped us to write an inventory for the items found in our Lost-and-Foundry.

In maths this week we have been focusing on our multiplication methods. We have learnt two methods used when multiplying a 2-digit number by 2 digits. The first was the area model (grid method) and then the expanded column method. Both methods require lots of mathematical thinking and steps and Class 3 made excellent progress using both methods. They were able to show this by solving some tricky problem solving and reasoning questions! Well done C3; superstars! They can show you these methods in their homework this week!

We had an amazing opportunity to use Virtual Reality Headsets last Friday! We went swimming with sharks (eek!), visited a Mayan temple and went to Dubai!


As part of our new science unit, Forces, we have been answering the question: What is gravity? To do this C3 planned and carried out their own scientific investigation by exploring if objects fall at the same rate. They decided on how they would investigate this by deciding on their equipment, considering fair testing and by making predictions. They then carried out the investigation and recorded their results in a way they preferred- graphs, tables and photos. As scientists, they explored the work of Sir Isaac Newton.

As geographers this week we have explored Earthquakes. We began by looking at the seismic monitoring system which showed us the earthquakes that had happened today, in the past two weeks, past month and past year. We discussed how earthquakes even happened on Christmas Day!! Class 3 then took part in three activities; they mapped earthquakes and their severity on a world map and carried out some research on some key earthquakes. Finally, they created their own 'stable, earthquake-resistant buildings' using marshmallows and straws. They tested the stability and structures of this on some JELLY! They considered how buildings should be built in earthquake-prone places.
