# Class 1 and 'Little Learners'

#### **EYFS**

This week we have been learning about Chinese New Year. We started the week off by having a taster of different rice and noodles and of course prawn crackers! The children really enjoyed using the chopsticks. We had a look on our world map as to where China is compared to England and looked at a powerpoint and book to find out how it is celebrated. So far, the children have practised their cutting, folding, painting and sticking skills to make some lucky red envelopes, some Chinese lanterns, some red dragons and practised writing with a quill in Chinese to say how old they are. We have also practised a Chinese dragon dance too!





























#### **Forest School**



The children enjoyed making fairy houses either independently or in groups using all of the natural materials around them. We used out 5 senses to explore outdoors and then the children finished by making a journey stick. Finally, we had a story and hot chocolate to complete the session. 


















#### Year 2

Year 2 have been very busy learning about information texts and instructions in literacy this week. The children wrote a 'double- page spread' all about an unusual pet and wrote subheadings to talk about how to home it, feed it etc and then added pictures.

In maths this week, we have been learning all about 2D and 3D shapes. We have been counting the sides and vertices on 2D shapes and sorting them. In science, we have been learning all about animals and living things. The children have learnt the 3 basic requirements for survival and the names of baby and adult animals.
