We will be carrying out the follow up measurements on children in year 1 and 7 where consent has not been previously withdrawn.

Class 2 news

Class 2 have got the term off to a busy start! They have already written their own poems based on The Black Hat in which they have used expanded noun phrases, similes and metaphors - The children have shown that they are all amazing poets!

In maths, Year 3 have been learning about mass by weighing objects, comparing mass and adding and subtracting grams and kilograms while Year 4 have been learning about decimals by counting in tenths and hundredths and dividing 1 and 2-digit numbers by 10 and 100.

In science we have been learning about electrical components and creating and testing circuits. In geography we have been learning about the human and physical features of the UK and the North East in particular. We will be comparing these to the Campania region in Italy to find similarities and differences.

In PE, the children have been practicing their fielding skills as part of their cricket lessons in preparation for a cricket tournament later in the term.

In computing we have been learning about animation and have created our own flipbooks and have started using an animation program called Pivot to create our own computer animations.

We have also had some visitors in school this week: Dare Master Danny Murphy and the Tees/Swale team from the AONB. We labelled the parts and functions of plants as well as playing some fun games based on what plants need to grow. We will be visiting Bowlees in June to visit the hay meadows.

All in all a busy and productive first 2 weeks back.




Message from Miss Lee to the FOCS
