Our Curriculum at Cotherstone


As subject leaders we have been busy developing our curriculum offer for our children here at Cotherstone as part of our two-year planning cycle. These have been designed to meet the needs of the pupils we have here within our school to not only offer them an exciting, ambitious curriculum that is sequential and builds on previous knowledge and skills, but equips our children with local history knowledge for example.

We have a rolling curriculum due to mixed-age classes so have Cycle A and Cycle B (the current cycle).

As such, we are very excited to publish for the new academic year **Cotherstone's 'Subject Overviews'.** Within these you can find the rationale behind how we teach each aspect of the curriculum, as well as Long Term Plans for what your child will be learning each term and an overview of the knowledge and skills they will develop throughout their journey at Cotherstone for each subject.
