# **Busy times in Class 3!**

We've had another busy few weeks in Class 3. We have been reading a scary story called *Clockwork* by Philip Pullman where we heard about a mysterious prince driving a horse and carriage but when it crashes into the palace court and kills the prince, his arm continues to move up and down as if lashing at the horses! We are creating a brochure to persuade people to visit the German town of Glockenheim where the story is set.

In maths we have investigated multiples and factors as well as using the formal written method for multiplying 4-digit numbers by 2-digit numbers.

The children planned, designed and conducted their own investigations to find out the effects of changing voltage and components in electrical circuits.

In history, we have studied the impact of WWII on various North Eastern towns including Darlington, Sunderland and Newcastle Upon Tyne. We learned how and why they became such important targets for German bombers and why industry was spread around the whole country.

In art, the children have been engaged in an artist study of various artists including: David Hockney, Paula Rego and Lubaina Himid. They have analysed paintings and styles by each artist, interpreted and tried to understand the meanings behind each painting, created stories around the paintings and recreated key elements of the works in tableau form. They have also learned to use different techniques to create their own pieces of art. Make sure that you check these out at Parents' evening!

The children have also taken part in a multi skills festival and some children volunteered for the county cross country trials - they ran 1800m and all tried their very best. Well done everyone!
