Preschool

Preschool have had a very busy week learning about 'Harvest', visiting St Cuthbert's church and the season of 'Autumn'. We have made finger print autumn trees and searched the grounds for different coloured leaves to make patterns and to decorate. We have made natural pictures using conkers and chalked our own autumn trees and designs.

Wow, we have been very busy in class 1 this week learning lots of new sounds and progressing with our reading using Little Wandle phonics. I can't believe the progress Reception have made learning to recognise lots of new sounds, reading words and Year 1/2 are doing a great job remembering all of those tricky words as well as reading fluently. The children have been making great progress in gymnastics too by creating different straight shapes, practising a variety of tuck positions and different ways to travel across the mats. Well done!

In Year 1/2, we have been learning the signs for greater than, less than and equal too and then comparing numbers. We completed practical activities initially and then tried to remember what each sign means. Eg A crocodile always wants to eat the largest number of fish, so the crocodiles open mouth (< or >)will always be open towards the higher number.


